For my job, I basically assist with anything with the word gender, from women's empowerment to transgender people's rights. During my assignment, I had the chance to attend many meetings and conferences on gender issues within the UN, and also with other NGOS in Vietnam, as well as the government. Also, helping to modify the Gender Induction for new comers has raised my awareness on how to be gender-responsive and gender-sensitive, such as using gender-sensitive language at work and also in my daily life.
